


About Sparkler

Sparkler is a mobile app for families with young children (prenatal – age 5). It's available for iOS an Android devices in English, Spanish, Chinese, French, and Arabic.

Your family can use Sparkler to:

- Know: Understand your child's development with the mobile Ages & Stages Questionnaires® (ASQ)
- Play: Spark early learning with fun, off-screen play activities to practice early skills with your child
- Grow: Follow your child's progress reaching milestones
- **Connect:** Get answers or support from your school, family resource center, home visitor, doctor, or other provider.




This activity book is designed to help children grow stronger hearts, words, minds, and bodies. These are the four Sparkler friends! Each one represents an area of learning.

Paint with nature

- Let's make some autumn art!
- Watch me cover the cut side of half an apple in paint and press it onto a sheet of paper. I made an apple print! Now it's your turn to make an apple print.
- Now let's dip pinecones into the paint and paint with them. What do pinecone prints look like? What other natural objects that we see in the autumn can we transform into art?



Making art with apples, pinecones, and other natural objects will help your child practice creativity, strengthen small muscles, and see everyday objects in new ways.








Fall Prints

Paint Your Pumpkin

Decorate a pumpkin

- Pumpkins are one of the plants people harvest in the fall. Sometimes, people decorate pumpkins!
- Let's paint our pumpkin. Should we paint a design on it ... or a picture ... or a face?



Painting and decorating a pumpkin will help your child practice creativity, focus, and using descriptive language to share their ideas.



Bob for Apples

Collect apples to grow muscles!

- 1 Let's bob for apples!
- 2 Use these tongs and see if you are able to pick up one of the apples floating in the water..
- It's tough to grab the slippery apples! Let's try one more time.








Bobbing for apples helps children practice gross motor skills as they reach, stretch, and balance, while also building fine motor skills by using χ their hands and fingers to hold and squeeze.




* Autumn Sorting

Sort nature's bounty

- Let's go outside and collect nature items! There are so many different seeds and leaves that fall from trees and flowers to the ground in the autumn. Let's bend down to pick them up and put them into a bag, basket — or just into our pockets!
- Let's sort the items in our collection. Let's put the leaves in one pile, the pinecones in another pile, and the acorns in another pile. We can create an "other" pile if we've collected other types of natural objects.
- Now, let's sort our items in another way. We can sort by size or by color. What other ways can we arrange our fall nature items?




Collecting and sorting will help your child practice noticing


* Pinecone Bird Feeder

Make a bird snack

- 1 It can be hard for birds to find food in the fall. Let's make a snack for them! I've tied a string around the top of a pinecone so that our bird feeder will be easy to hang up for the birds.
- Let's use a popsicle stick to spread nut butter (or seed butter) on the pinecone's scales. Then, we can roll the pinecone in birdseed!
- Let's hang our bird feeder in a tree for the birds. How do you think they will feel when they discover this yummy treat?



Making a bird feeder will help your child practice caring for animals, strengthen small muscles, and build empathy.




Make art with pumpkin seeds

- Let's make art with the seeds from our pumpkin!
- 2 Start by squeezing glue all around the piece of cardboard. Let's watch the glue drip all around.
- Now, let's pick up a pumpkin seed and stick it into the glue. Can you cover all of the glue with pumpkin seeds? Let's let the glue dry and then admire the pumpkin seed masterpiece you created!





Making art with pumpkin seeds will help your child practice fine motor skills, notice patterns, and create their own masterpiece.

Observe the Fall

- Let's go on a walk outside and look for signs of fall!
- The air feels cooler! The sun is rising later in the morning! Birds and butterflies are migrating south! The leaves are starting to change from green to brown, orange, yellow, and red! Acorns and leaves are falling off the trees! Let's see if we can spot any squirrels eating acorns and getting ready to hibernate for winter!
- How many signs of fall can we spot as we walk around outside together?




Going on a fall walk will help your child practice noticing changes in nature, build curiosity, and use words to describe what they see.





Our Sparkler friends went for a fall walk. Can you help discover all the fall items in the picture?







