## Who's In My Family?

Families are one of the first places children learn about love, belonging, and connection. On this episode of the Little Kids, Big Hearts podcast, **Who's In My Family**, three kids — Georgia, Jaden, and Carmine — join host Todd Loyd to talk about what makes their families special, from everyday routines to meaningful traditions. The children then travel with Todd to the Land of Qook-a-lackas, where they meet a Qook-a-lacka friend, Quilliam (played by the wonderful Ryann Redmond), who is worried that their family is “just too teeny-weeny” to be part of a special DreamFest quilt. Through storytelling, shared memories, and imaginative play, the kids help Quilliam discover that families don't have to look a certain way to be full of love — it's the care, connection, and moments shared together that matter most.

These activities are designed to help children explore and celebrate the many different kinds of families they see in their own lives and communities. By reflecting on family routines, traditions, and moments of inclusion, children build empathy, emotional awareness, and a strong sense of belonging — both for themselves and for others.

### Family Quilt

Pre-K to 4<sup>th</sup> Grade



#### Goals

- ♥ Encouraging sense of identity and belonging
- ♥ Building curiosity and understanding
- ♥ Building expressive language

#### Instructions

#### Materials



##### Get Ready! Here's what you'll need:

- ♥ Squares of paper
- ♥ Crayon/markers/colored pencils
- ♥ Tape or staples

#### Discussion



- ♥ What are some different ways families can look?
- ♥ What are some different people who can be part of a family?
- ♥ What do all families have in common? How might they be different?
- ♥ Can families change over time?
- ♥ How might it feel to be part someone else’s family that is different from yours?
- ♥ Why do you think it’s important to be kind and curious about other families?

#### Activity



- ♥ All families are different and the people who make up a family can be connected in lots of different ways, just like fabric that connects to make a quilt. Let’s think about YOUR family!
- ♥ Let’s make a quilt square to represent your family.
  - ♥ Who are the people in your family?
  - ♥ What do you like to do together?
- ♥ Write or draw three things that represent your family.
- ♥ Every child can make a square with their own ideas!
- ♥ Let’s connect our squares together to make a quilt just like in the Little Kids, Big Hearts podcast!

### Family Album

Pre-K to 4th Grade



#### Goals

- ♥ Develop understanding of identity
- ♥ Build early literacy skills
- ♥ Practice fine motor skills

### Instructions



#### Play the Episode

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### Materials



#### Get Ready! Here's what you'll need:

- 2-3 Pieces of Plain Paper
- Pencils/Markers/Colored Pencils
- Tape or Stapler

### Discussion



#### Let's talk about families!

- What is a family?
- What are important things to think about when we're talking about other people's families?
- What is your family like?
- What makes your family special?

### Activity



- Let's make a book about our families!
- Fold your paper into a book. Staple or tape it together.
- Create a cover for your book that represents your family!
- On the first page, write, draw, or paste pictures of the people in your family.
- On the second page, write or draw about what your family likes to do together.
- On the third page, write or draw about where your family lives.
- Now, let's take turns reading and sharing our books! It's so fun to see how all of our families are similar and different.
